From the Church Office...

There have been a lot of changes at Holy Rosary in the last few weeks. However you may feel about those changes, most people are concerned, befuddled, or even outraged by recent events and how they perceive that they have been handled. In truth, every parishioner has justification for their feelings.

We have had our pastor take a medical leave of absence. We have had our associate pastor reassigned to another parish. It was announced that a deacon (me) would handle the administrative duties of the parish in Fr. Mark's absence. We were given a fine priest, Fr. Bob Weiss, for our sacramental needs, but only for a short while. To add to the injury, we have been given little or no information as to what the future holds for our parish.

Who wouldn't be frustrated?

Truly, as Catholics, we should know better. No one expected our Bishop to die. No one expected Fr. Mark to need a leave of absence for his health. No one expected the movement of so many priests in our Diocese that would leave us without leadership, at least in appearance. This is not how we are conditioned to experience parish life; but this is, in fact, what we are experiencing.

So let's take a breath. We've had seven pastors in our short history as a parish and more associates than I can truly remember. A good number of the priests of this diocese have passed through our doors. Some we liked, some we didn't. Such is life. We know better. I have no idea how long Fr. Mark will be away. I know that it is important that we pray for him during this time.

My task is to handle the day-to-day administrative needs of the parish; to help realign any financial shortfalls, and to make a well functioning parish ready to hand off.

Holy Rosary is a great Parish, a great school, both full of great people, and it is the only home I've ever known. We can find peace in this.

Associate Pastor Arriving Soon



Father John B. C. O'Neill, who has served as the chaplain for the Dominican Campus, has been appointed associate pastor at Holy Rosary Church and chaplain to the Sisters of Mercy at their convent in Nashville, effective Sept. 1, 2017.

Fr. John B. C. O'Neill

I was born October 1, 1956, in Dublin, Ireland, to James and Martha O'Neill. My father was a pediatric surgeon and my mother, a resident in oncology. We were seven sons and one daughter, and I was the fourth son. The family rosary was very important and my father and mother led it every night.

I started medical school in 1974 and qualified in 1981. It is only as I look back now that I realize what a privileged Catholic medical education it was. Virtually all of the Chiefs of Staff were daily communicants. For instance, the obstetricians were not only radically pro-life, but also explicit and staunch proponents of Humane Vitae.

The first year as a doctor was spent as an intern in medicine and surgery in Ireland and the next five years as a resident in surgery in Norwich and Manchester in England. The Irish and English are supposed to be ancient rivals, but I have to say I have found the English to be a wonderful and kind people.

The residency prepared me for three years as a mission surgeon '87-'90 in the Diocese of Rawalpindi, Punjab, Pakistan. What an experience! The people were almost 100 percent Islamic and desperately poor. I cannot tell you how much I loved them. Most of my work was as a crisis obstetrician. The resources were truly minimal – I recall doing a cesarean section in the pitch dark with a religious sister holding a flashlight over my shoulder.

It was something of a relief to return to St. Vincent's University Hospital, Dublin, as a resident in vascular surgery '90-'93. I was very involved in the Legion of Mary and canvassing for Right to Life in our national elections. But my number was up! Sister Manus Daly, R.N. #she must be obeyed) had me in her sights. This marvelous woman ran the best emergency room in south Dublin and was feared by all who knew her, all of south Dublin! She was absolutely convinced that God meant me to be a priest, dismissing all of my objections as piffle. One day I saw her escorting, as the sole mourner, the pauper's casket of a homeless man. I knew the time had come. That night I wrote to Bishop O'Connell and asked to be considered as a diocesan seminarian for the Diocese of Knoxville.

The intervening years have flown by with time in Conception Seminary, Missouri; Kenrick Seminary, St. Louis; priest assignments at St. Jude's in Chattanooga and at Holy Ghost in Knoxville. I have been at The Dominican Campus since 2010.

Parish Council Updates

Official Meeting Minutes from MONDAY, July 10, 2017 at 7:00 PM

Present: Stephen Aleman, Tom Kleespies, Erin Mullican, Patty Sullivant, Kay Baker, Marie Stewart, Cathy Sisco, Jan Stermin, Emily Carr and Savannah Evans

Absent: Fr. Mark Hunt, Mike Huffman and Rebecca Soto

Presenter: Cindy Caluger, Parish Bookkeeper and Chrissa Jennings, Music Director

Emily Carr opened the meeting with a prayer.

The Minutes of the June 5th meeting were open for corrections or discussion. Kay Baker moved that the Minutes be accepted as written. The motion was seconded and approved.

Cindy Caluger passed out copies of the 2017 2018 Church Budget which was approved by the Finance Committee and requires the Parish Council's review and approval. It was noted that the past year's collections are short of the budgeted amount. Tom Kleespies raised concerns about the empty places in the pews on Sundays. It was affirmed that many parishioners are now attending mass at the Mercy Convent. This is a major concern for the viability of the parish.

Concern about recouping the money expended on the HVAC/ Windows in the school was raised. Since the Home & School and the School Board are unaware of their responsibility to raise funds to replace the Church savings used to pay the HVAC/ Windows, Stephen Aleman suggested that he draft request of the Finance Committee to seek relief of this "debt" from the School Board and the Home & School Association. Stephen will present such a draft at the next Parish Council meeting for approval before passing it on to the Finance Committee.

After discussion, the members of the Parish Council agreed to accept the presented 2017 2018 Church Budget.

Committee <u>highlights</u> reported (submitted written reports available online):

Parish Mission – Jan Stermin noted the final finishes to be put in place for the Parish Mission to be held on August 13 through August 15. She asked that all invite others to the Mission. It was suggested that we have name tags available for Parish Council and Parish Mission Committee members to wear at Sunday masses that state "Ask me about the Mission." Stephen will produce the name tags and Chrissa will have them available at the Sunday masses. Cathy Sisco will be the contact to purchase Parish Shirts to be worn during the Mission. Chrissa Jennings will enlist older children to help and offer service hours. Savannah Evans will reach out to school children during orientation. Jan would like to set RSVP deadline as August 1st.

Knights of Columbus – Tom Kleespies reported the sale of Boston Butts over the 4th of July went well and noted the role of the Knights during the Parish Mission.

Education – Jan Stermin said there will be a meeting on July 19th in the Large Conference Room at 7PM to discuss educational opportunities such as Adult Continuing Education, Bible Studies, Small Faith Groups, etc. She invited everyone to join the planning meeting.

There will be a Parish Game Night on September 30th. Details to follow

Also, Evening Angels had their planning meeting and they scheduled events for the coming year. (See List on Page 5)

Parish Life – Patty Sullivant/Cathy Sisco have gift cards to present to Zetia Patterson and Tina Chilton. There will be no reception. Anne Erickson and Lee Juday will be honored on Catechetical Sunday, Sept. 17 during Coffee & Donuts.

Social Action – Kay Baker said the welcome basket was given to the Refugee Family in the corner house. It was well received and needed as they stated they were out of food.

Spirituality – Marie Stewart/Emily Carr noted the Living Rosary will be October 8th with a Pot Luck following. The Spirituality Committee met and they are working on bringing the Church and Academy closer. They have several ideas in the works. Marie would like to find and/or develop a Vision Statement and Mission Statement for the Parish to work with in the future.

Communication – Erin Mullican has Kara Stephens upgrading the website and Lisa Link is still taking care of the Facebook Page. Youth Rep – Savannah Evans volunteered to put her Instagram skills to work with Erin Mullican's vision to improve communications.

Parish Announcement and clarification – Chrissa Jennings said that "unofficially" that Fr. Mark is on a medical leave of absence. There is no official announcement yet due to Fr. Mike Johnston, Administrator of the Diocese, is out of the office on vacation. There will be updates and announcements as they become available. Everyone is asked to pray for Fr. Mark and for the Parish.

Due to the above information some events will be postponed or changed. The Parish Mission however will continue as planned.


